This second term has seen our team doing major county school rallies where thousands of students were in attendance. Others were just weekend challenges and the turnout of many young men and women was realized. Emetik girls' high school and a neighboring school

had more than 400 students getting saved!

Machakos county rally where more than 3000 students attended, about 1000 of them got saved. Kathonzweni rally in Makueni county had 200 students getting saved. Everywhere we have gone, the Lord has confirmed His word by saving many students.

You see these students getting saved could have been recruited into radical religions or faiths. Life Changers and High School Ministry



The Life Changers program that is charged with reaching the university, college and generally young people in Thika, have been up to task this half of the year. The current Life

changers in the program are four namely; Peter Mbandu, Daniel Kineene, Ken Mwenda and Vincent Pande. They are working and serving with nine colleges and three hostels and for a period of 11 months, Life changers have managed to talk to 900 students about the gospel of the Lord Jesus through one-on-one evangelism, Bible study and Cu fellowships. Out of these; 40 students got saved, 25 and 30 students have gone through discipleship and mentorship respectively.

They have conducted two leadership training seminars and four local missions in partnership with the Christian Unions in the institutions they are serving. The local missions were very fruitful, over 600 souls were won to the Lord.

High School Students Ministry has majorly concentrated on Central, Eastern and North Eastern regions of Kenya

through Impact weekends, discipleship that saw leadership trainings, and empowerment summits.

Since February, a number of impact weekends have been conducted across the country, two empowerment summits; one in Lodwar Boys - Turkana County and another one in Thika at Acmi grounds. We have also facilitated a CU leaders training at Marsabit Boys and discipleship program in several schools. A total of 298 high schools have been visited, 9,457 stu-

dents reached and of them 2,368 coming to Jesus. We thank God



Operation Hope

We currently have 116 children in Operation Hope, that are sponsored. In the first half of 2016, we had our annual Camp in April, we ministered to 65 children and 10 of them accepted Christ into their lives. Many others got delivered. The theme was **"I am precious to God"**. Alongside learning there was counselling, and playing.

Last year, we had 13 candidates for the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education, which qualifies and determines which high school a student will join. There were 4 candidates for the Kenya certificate of Secondary education (high school) equivalent to exams taken in Grade 12 and it determines which University they are qualified to enter. Of these, two of them will be joining University in the September 2016. The children's school dues were paid in full, they received school uniforms, bags and shoes. The camps and follow up in schools, has consequentially boosted their self esteem and their general outlook of life.

During the activity packed week, we held a 5-day open air evangelistic meeting in Kiang'ombe.
